

# Immigration Law Update

## *Hiring Foreign-Born RNs and Allied Health Care Workers*

### Web Seminar

June 17, 2009

10 a.m. – 11:30 a.m. PST

#### Description:

Hospitals regularly utilize the services of foreign-born health care professionals. This web seminar will explain the procedures for obtaining temporary visas and permanent residence for registered nurses and other types of allied health care professionals, such as physical and occupational therapists, and clinical laboratory specialists. The seminar will also address the responsibilities hospitals have in complying with the recently updated I-9 employee verification system.

#### Learning Objectives:

##### **Web seminar participants will:**

- ✓ Learn how to obtain temporary visas and permanent residence for RNs and allied health care workers; and
- ✓ Learn about pending legislation that would speed the immigration process for RNs and PTs.

#### Faculty:

Carl Shusterman is a graduate of the UCLA School of Law. He served as an attorney for the U.S. Immigration and Naturalization Service (INS) until 1982, when he entered private practice. He is authorized to practice before the Supreme Court of California, the Federal District Court, the U.S. Court of Appeals, the Sixth, Seventh and Ninth Circuits, and the Supreme Court of the United States.

In addition, he has been voted a Super Lawyers Corporate Counsel Edition every year since 2002.
